PLANTING TIPS:


The Karley Rose Pennisetum are perennials and can be planted out in the landscape after using in the container. The Diamond Frost Euphorbia and Royal Glissade Coleus are excellent houseplants and can be repotted and brought inside for winter.

MATERIALS:

Oval container: 24-in. long by 12-in. wide All-purpose potting soil

PLANTS:

- 3 (A) Karley Rose Pennisetum
- 4 (B) Sangria Ornamental Peppers
- 2 (C) Royal Glissade Coleus
- 3 (D)Diamond Frost Euphorbia
- 4 (E) Superbells Coralina Calibrachoa
- 1 (F) 6-pack of Creeping Jenny
