Non-profit Project Evergreen recently teamed up with the urban gardening program New York City Parks GreenThumb to provide a "green oasis amid a concrete jungle" in NYC's Clinton Community Garden.

The garden serves as a connection point for old and new residents, and volunteers from the green industry and area residents came together to install new planting beds, raise existing beds and regrade the site to eliminate standing water, install a shade garden, plant new ornamental shrubs, flowers and vegetables and make other site improvements like a paver patio and gravel path.
